By Faith Alone? Yikes!!

Then [Jesus] said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." (John 20:27-29)

If you have not yet figured it out, you, I, and our fellow siblings in Christ are those whom Jesus was thinking about when he offered his blessing. So, how does it feel to be the direct recipient of Jesus' blessing? And, how blessed do you feel to be one of those who must believe through faith, with the ongoing help of the Holy Spirit, instead of by direct contact with the corporeal Jesus?

Before you feel left out of the first disciples' experience and the evidence they were uniquely privy to, please recognize that Jesus is paying you and me a glorious tribute compared to Thomas, who required more proof. And we, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, place our trust in the faithfulness those saints have displayed for us. With the Spirit's unceasing guidance and assurance, we, in turn, are the ones who serve as an example for those who are new to the faith and those who will come after us. So, how we serve, in all times and circumstances, with faithfulness or without, plays an important role in helping guide and sustain those yet to be called to serve the same faith Lord.

Take heart in Jesus' blessing and Jesus' complement to your sightless faith, which does not require seeing but our faith alone. Faith that demands sight is like faith that demands proof: there can be no true belief when evidence is needed.

First Quarter Financial Report-2024

Income Expense \$89,182.79 \$80,858.60

Through the first quarter of 2024, we have received 30% of the budgeted income and have spent 20% of the budgeted expenses. The percentage of expenses is in line with previous years' expenses.

We are thankful for the additional giving in the first quarter which enables us to end the quarter with a positive balance. Continued increased contributions will enable the congregation to meet our financial challenges and continue to provide the same level of ministry.

As you may know, several of our Holy Trinity family members have served on work teams for Luther Disaster Response (LDR) in the mainland United States and Puerto Rico. During April, we will be collecting donations for our stewardship focus to help fund the life-giving activities of this local group as they prepare to travel to Florida to assist in restoring people's lives by restoring homes that families lost during recent storms. Beth and Tom Smith will be in worship on Sunday, April 7, to offer a temple talk to provide us with details about this upcoming trip and the vital humanitarian work this team is up to. Please be present that day to hear from them; please consider giving generously to their efforts and those of the team of volunteers they represent.

Congregational Gatherings in April

There will be two important gatherings in April to discuss the future of Holy Trinity. **Sunday, April 14,** there will be a forum following the morning worship service. The Congregation Council plans to present several options (with details and implications for each) for discussion. The discussion will help the Council reduce the options for a final congregational vote.

Sunday, April 28, will be the annual Spring Congregational Meeting following the morning worship service. As part of the meeting, the Congregation Council plans to conduct a vote to set definitively the direction for the congregation.

The Council hopes to have both meetings in the Sanctuary, so that they can be livestreamed. While the meetings will be available for viewing while they occur, there will not be a way for viewers to participate. Also, the livestream will probably **not** be available for later viewing.

New Bible Exploration

For those participating in the Bible study of Romans, remember there will not be class on Tuesday, March 26 (Holy Week) or Tuesday, April 2. We will resume the study on Tuesday, April 9 at 11:00 AM.

Continuing on Tuesdays you are invited to join in a study of the book of *Romans*. The study will take place each Tuesday morning from 11:00 AM to roughly 12:00 PM. "In his *Preface to Romans* Martin Luther writes, 'this epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and is truly the purest gospel...It is a bright light, almost sufficient to illuminate the entire Holy Scriptures'" (*Martin Luther's Basic Theological Writings*, second ed., Fortress, 2005 pp. 98-99). *Romans* is also the most challenging of the Pauline epistles and will likely provide those participating with significant, in-depth discussion and new ideas to chew on as we wade through it and learn and grow together in our faith lives and our relationships with God and our Lord. There will be sign-up sheet in the Gathering Area for those who are interested in participating.
