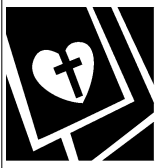

Last evening I attended the opening night of Vacation Bible School. It was a blessing to experience the excitement of staff and children, and to feel the positive energy VBS creates. It was good to see the youth of the congregation helping to make VBS happen.

The youth of this congregation are amazing. They actively participate in the life of this congregation. They are in worship, Youth Choir, Handbells, and serve as ushers and acolytes. Local Lutheran Churches Explore Cooperative Ministry

Winnie Gerlach and I were privileged to attend a gathering of lay people representing 10 Lutheran Churches in our conference to discuss the possibility of forming a shared lay ministry task force. At this gathering, we each told of things that our home churches were doing for the common good and several challenges that we would like to improve. We all felt that co-operative ministry within our congregations would give us much better results than trying to struggle alone. Things like giving better spiritual help to young families and helping our communities with issues of poverty, addiction, etc.

The group felt strongly that it was important that we understand this is not to share Pastors nor was it to combine congregations or close church buildings. It was a way to "get things done." It was agreed that first we need to identify the strengths and the needs. To do this, our first step is for the group to visit each other's church for a Sunday service with a short meeting afterward. As this is happening, we will get a better understanding of what we need to focus on and where to begin.

150th Anniversary

What is significant about the year 1868? Andrew Johnson was the president of the United States, and our nation was going through Reconstruction after the Civil War. More importantly to us, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church was founded on November 5, which means this year is the 150th anniversary of our ministry!

This is significant not only for us, but also for the community because Holy Trinity was the first church to be established within the Borough of Ephrata.

Our Anniversary Committee consists of Lois Beck, Deb Martin, Phyllis Peters, Barry Kreider, Norm Wangman, and church staff. We have been busy planning a celebration!

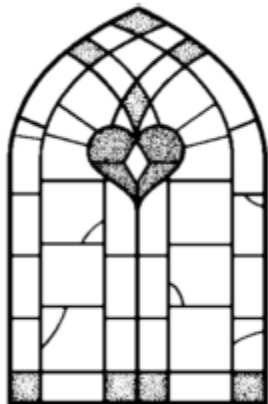
Our committee welcomes your input. If you have any ideas of something special to honor this milestone, please talk with any member of the committee.
