

Pastor Letter

A lot of my friends don't really want to go to their church. But we want to be here, and the older people in our church can see that...so they want us to be here. Our whole church treats us like we're the church of today, not just the church of the future. —Ashlee, age 17

Yesterday during worship, we experienced the joy of publicly recognizing the academic accomplishments of seven of our young people, who have recently graduated from, or will soon graduate from, various levels of education. I find these opportunities to spotlight and celebrate these milestones to be an important means of reminding ourselves and those of the younger generation, who are gift to our church families, how important they are to the life of our congregations. Because they are younger, we of the older generation sometimes forget they have God-given gifts and keen insights to share, which benefit the mission of God's church and positively affect how it is carried out. Through their involvement they introduce vitality and forward thinking to our conversations and they enliven our worship, while opening our eyes, hearts, and minds to what it is to be faithful servants in our modern, ever-changing world.

The above quote is from the book *Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies To Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church*; the research for which came from studies carried out by the Fuller Youth Institute. Much of their research and conclusions came from interviewing young people, ages 15 – 29, regarding their experiences in their congregations and what keeps them involved in and attracted to their churches, not to mention, how we as the church can most effectively love and serve these fellow servants of God. It may come as a surprise, but it is not about flashy worship or a multitude of youth group activities. Likewise, it is not about the size of the church and its congregation, or its location, the age of the church or its congregants, a specific denomination, its "cool factor," a modern building, a big budget, a contemporary worship style, and slick ministry programs. "For young people today, relational warmth is the new cool...feeling at home transcends any building...[and] when it comes to churches that grow young, there is no age discrimination."

The core of growing young as a congregation and helping to keep young people engaged and committed is the building of relationships with them that sincerely display how valued they are. It is taking

time to ask them questions about their lives as well as about their faith. It is about showing them how much we appreciate their gifts and their willingness to share them, while inviting them to be an equal part of our faith communities, seeking their opinions and listen to their ideas.

Our young people need us to love them unconditionally, listening to them without judgement or criticism, treating them as equals who have been called to serve God, as each of us has been called, and empowering them by offering them opportunities to serve God alongside us. So, the next time you are around young people, take the time to show a sincere interest in them. Thank them for their service as part of the faith community. Ask them about what is going on in their lives. Take them seriously and really listen to what they are saying. Invite them to be part of whatever activities and ministries you are involved in or encourage them to get involved in areas that interest them. Each one of them is an extraordinary gift from God and a fellow child of God who is worth knowing and learning from.

Let us commit to growing young together by showing appreciation for our young people and building the relational warmth they are seeking from the older generation. Let us be a community that values our young people and is willing to learn from them and grow in our faith and service to God with them. Pastor Mark
