As with any organization when there is a staff reduction there is a need to prioritize tasks. Our priorities must lie with those things that are vital for the future of our congregation and with those things that are an essential part of our worship. Sunday school and a Worship Committee were top priorities. A heartfelt and grateful thank you to all of those individuals who have volunteered to serve in this capacity! Debbie Fortna, our new organist, will be a vital part of the worship committee, determining things like the hymns, liturgical setting,

etc. Pastor, council, usher teams and altar guild have all picked up extra tasks. So, in evaluating what were necessities and what perhaps were not, it was decided that the hymn boards were redundant to the bulletins. All of the hymn numbers are already listed in the bulletins and for the 60% of the congregation using the large format bulletins, the full hymns are in there as well. Can we do without the hymn boards? Certainly. Is it different than what we are used to? Absolutely! Can something be done to keep them in use? Yes, new volunteers to step forward and take on the responsibility. Keep in mind it is not always just a once weekly change. During Advent and Lent there is Wednesday worship, Eve services, and daily changes during Holy Week. We would love to have some new volunteers as well for altar guild – we are one person short of being able to start a new team. Currently we have only three teams. Ideally, we would have four. There are numerous opportunities to help by serving on the various committees within our church. There is still one open council position. Likely there will be other small changes in the coming year as we adjust to a new organist and new ways of doing things with our reduced staff and new opportunities to serve. Thank you for your patience and grace during this time of change and I hope you will look forward to the exciting new opportunities this year may bring.
