SHARING THE LOVE OF CHRISTMAS

It is not a surprise to any of us, who are of the Christian faith, that the celebration of Christmas is becoming more and more secular and commercialized each year. I remember well the four years I spent between full-time calls as a pastor in Upstate New York working part-time in congregations and part-time as an employee of Macy's department store and cringing when the Christmas trees and flood of decorations would annually appear the week after Halloween. The Macy's elves worked overtime to transform the vast retail space into their version of what the season of Christmas was all about and wanted consumers to believe and buy into it as well.

This experience of being altogether emersed in the fake, misguided world of consumer Christmas left a bad taste in my mouth every year, and until recently left me irritated at what seemed to be the hijacking of "my" Christian holiday, a holiday reserved for Christians alone. All others, stay away! After all, I do not celebrate Hanukkah or Kwanza or any other holidays that are associated with other faiths or cultures, Lunar New Year excluded. I do not pretend to be something I am not and insert myself into others' celebrations that simply have an air of fascination to me but a sacred meaning to others who rightly and respectfully observe them.

However, recently, I have come to the belief that the joyful hope given to the world and all God's children who inhabit it is not mine or anyone else's to limit. The love of God that entered world in the gift of the Messiah is not solely ours to distribute to those we deem as worthy while withholding it from others. It does not belong exclusively to those who claim Christianity as their own. Instead, it is a gift to be universally shared in the hope that its power to change hearts, minds, and lives will do just that, and bring peace and good will to places and relationships where it is desperately needed, while lifting the burdens and calming the fears of those who suffer unnecessarily.

So, as we observe and take seriously this time of faithful waiting for the hope and promise of the Messiah, let us each, who claim the gift of Christmas as our own, consider how we can and will share universally the love of Christmas with all God's children as living signs of *good news of great joy for all the people* (Luke 2:10).
