Boiler Replacement

Last fall when the heating contractor performed routine service on the building's boilers, it was determined that our oldest boiler could not be repaired and needed to be replaced. We have a second boiler that was installed when the addition was constructed.

Our previous boilers were purchased from Burnham Corporation in Lancaster. Not only does Burnham produce excellent products, but we were able to purchase them at a discount because a member worked for the company.

Due to current members having a relative working for Burnham, the congregation was again able to purchase a new boiler at a substantial discount. The boiler with a new burner has been installed by Leffler Energy. The cost for all the work, including removal of the old burner and preparation for the new one, was \$18,535. The cost was paid using building fund offerings.
