February Congregation Council Meeting Report

At the February 8 Congregation Council Meeting, the council:

• Met with Assistant to the Bishop Deacon Marsha Roscoe and synod Treasurer Joe Stepansky. They made recommendations to reduce significantly the congregation's budget, most of which the Finance Committee and Council have considered. They reviewed with the Council several options for the congregation going forward. The Council will consider these recommendations as it prepares options and recommendations for the congregation to consider at the April 28 congregational meeting.

Heard a report from Treasurer Larry Hummer that the 2023 audit was conducted by Dean Hoover of WNC, Reamstown. All 2023 financial reports are accurate and there were no findings or recommendations for changes.

• Decided **not** to contract with Partners for Sacred Spaces for a study costing \$12,000 to determine how our building might be better used, especially for rental income.

As a Reconciling in Christ organization, all people are invited and welcome to enjoy the goodness of God's creation through the community at camp.

Why Camp? A place for Christ-centered community

Daniel comes from a family that is all about baseball. Their vacations and their summer plans all revolve around coaching, playing, and refereeing games and visiting famous ballparks and baseball history museums. But every summer, Daniel makes sure that he has one week set aside to go to camp – even if it means missing a game or two.

"A week at camp is like nothing else I do," Daniel says. "It's different than being on a team playing a game. Our cabin group – and the whole camp community – is like a family. The counselors are fun, and you can tell they really care about us, and nobody has to be the



best at anything – we just have fun together! And I like talking about God with the staff and other people my age."

Camp provides daily opportunities for prayer, faithful conversation with other Christians, stewardship of God's Creation, elements of service to God and others, and daily devotions. We hear and experience God's Word, and have opportunities to put it immediately into practice. We live out our baptismal promises, reminded that we are named, claimed, and sent. It's an immersion in a loving, grace-filled community of Christ that offers us the a glimpse of the promised Kingdom - a fully immersive experience of the loving presence of Jesus, thanks to the gift of the Holy Spirit - and, as Daniel reminds us, we also have a lot of fun.

Maybe it's time we rethink the value we place on church camp. It really does reinforce everything we teach about being a beloved child of God and allows us to encounter the living Christ in powerful ways.

Beginning Tuesday, February 27 you are invited to join in a study of the book of *Romans*. The study will take place each Tuesday morning from 11:00 AM to roughly 12:00 PM. "In his *Preface to Romans* Martin Luther writes, 'this epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and is truly the purest gospel...It is a bright light, almost sufficient to illuminate the entire Holy Scriptures'" (*Martin Luther's Basic Theological Writings*, second ed., Fortress, 2005 pp. 98-99). *Romans* is also the most challenging of the Pauline epistles and will likely provide those participating with significant, in-depth discussion and new ideas to chew on as we wade through it and learn and grow together in our faith lives and our relationships with God and our Lord.
