As we separate ourselves from the hectic and distracting nature of the holiday season, let us take full advantage of the sacred time we have been gifted to consider the extraordinary event that has taken place through God's intimate presence among us, and allow that good news to transform our relationship with our Creator and our Savior who now abides with us.
