"To mock another person is to insult their maker."

I recently heard this quote referred to in a sermon presented by Bishop Jim Dunlop when he visited with the North Lancaster and Lancaster Conferences of our synod. The quote has stuck with me amid the current overwhelming bombardment of media information that is saturating our lives as the approach of the Iowa Caucuses next week looms large. The general ugliness and vitriolic language that is often thrown back and forth between candidates, as well as between their paid pundits and supporters has ramped-up to an alarming level that continues to widen the divide between families, friends, and neighbors and is at times frightening with death threats and promises of violence becoming an acceptable part of the status quo.

The quote with which I began this brief article reminds us that we are each created in the loving image of God. That "other," with whom we disagree, think unpleasant thoughts about, and/or refuse to interact with, is loved by the same God who loves us, and despite our negative opinion of them is equally worthy to be respected as a child of God rather than mocked and judged by our individual standards and personal biases. When we allow God's love to be the filter through which we perceive the other person and through which we approach our conversations with them we create Christ-centered space that blesses us with common ground on which to interact with civility and respect and an appreciation for God's creation that is alive and beautiful in others. As we navigate the present political season, which is awash with ugliness and the temptation to criticize and judge our neighbor because their opinions are opposite ours, let us strive to be living examples of God's love by seeing the maker and perfecter of all things wonderfully active in them. Child Protection Policy Training

Our new church insurance policy requires that all persons of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, staff and volunteers alike, who presently have a background check on file or wish to volunteer during 2024 must attend an annual child protection training at which the congregational Child Protection Policy is reviewed. To assist you in fulfilling this requirement there will be a training for all those to whom this applies on **Sunday**, **February 25 during the Adult Forum**. There will be sign-up sheet in the Gathering Area, so please include your name so we can make sure there are enough materials available for everyone attending the training.

Stewardship Special Giving for January Mountaineer's Table

We are excited to be adding *Mountaineer'sTable* to our list of organizations whose live-giving work we support as the people of God at Holy Trinity. *Mountaineer'sTable* (a 501c3 organization), formerly known as the *Ephrata Power Packs Project*, is in its 10th year of serving families in the Ephrata Area School District (EASD). In 2022 alone, they distributed over 135,000 lbs. of food, feeding an average of 75 families a week, and are presently serving 110 families per week with numbers of those facing daily food insecurity rising. There is no cost to EASD families, who each Thursday arrive at the Ephrata Church of the Brethren to collect their nutritious food, including fresh fruits and vegetables, and a recipe with the needed ingredients provided to prepare the meal. It is an all-volunteer organization, so all monies donated go directly to help the families get food on the table so that children are well fed and ready to learn.

Stephanie Weber, the director and visionary behind this organization, will be joining us in worship on Sunday, January 7 to further introduce us to the important work being done to assist our struggling neighbors. Please plan to be present at 9:00 AM worship to welcome her and learn more.
