These questions were asked or comments were made during the annual Congregation Meeting on December 3, 2023. Some answers were provided at that time.

- 1. What percentage of members contribute financially? Approximately 70%
- 2. What criteria define an active member? Contribute on record and commune annually.
- 3. We need honest conversations among all of us.
- a. What can each of us do to address the [financial] challenges ahead of us? The church needs ~\$7800 weekly. There are 107 active units, including young adults living at home.
- b. If 60 giving units are active, an average of \$131 / week is required from each.
- c. If 40 giving units are active, an average of \$197 / week is required from each.
- 4. Suggest more frequent [financial] updates in the Messenger and bulletin.
- 5. Have we considered fund-raising events? These are discouraged in the Lutheran Church as the congregation should be able to support itself.
- 6. Are rent monies collected considered fund-raising? No, these go to the Unified Budget.
- 7. If the congregation sells the facility can we stipulate that we can keep full access to a portion (e.g. sanctuary)? We won't really know until we attempt to sell.
- 8. Are we actively communicating with other congregations about similar issues? Yes, in a limited fashion.
- 9. Is the synod helping in this process? The synod will help if directly asked.
- 10. Are other denominations eligible for merger at a congregational level? The ELCA has full communion with the Presbyterian Church of America, United Church of Christ, Reformed Church in America, Moravian Church, United Methodist Church and the Episcopal Church.
- 11. A transition to half-time ministry is not [and should not be seen as] a failure as amazing things can still happen.
- 12. The church is approaching a counter-culture status.
- 13. The synod has resources to help us if we ask.
- 14. Is the church secretary a full-time position? Yes. The position is salaried with vacation included. Hours not worked are not paid.
- 15. During the pastoral call process, an overwhelming concern was pastoral care. Will a half-time staff be supported by the congregation? Pastoral care will need to be internal (peer-peer) rather than from staff.
- 16. Is the consulting firm being considered to assist with additional building use to be paid on a one-time or continuing basis? One-time
- 17. The congregation was reminded that Biblical guidance is for a tithe contribution.

Child Protection Policy Training

Our new church insurance policy requires that all persons of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, staff and volunteers alike, who presently have a background check on file or wish to volunteer during 2024 must attend an annual child protection training at which the congregational Child Protection Policy is reviewed. To assist you in fulfilling this requirement there will be a training for all those to whom this applies on **Sunday**, **February 25 during the Adult Forum**. There will be sign-up sheet in the Gathering Area, so please include your name so we can make sure there are enough materials available for everyone attending the training.

Stewardship Special Giving for January Mountaineer's Table

We are excited to be adding *Mountaineer'sTable* to our list of organizations whose live-giving work we support as the people of God at Holy Trinity. *Mountaineer'sTable* (a 501c3 organization), formerly known as the *Ephrata Power Packs Project*, is in its 10th year of serving families in the Ephrata Area School District (EASD). In 2022 alone, they distributed over 135,000 lbs. of food, feeding an average of 75 families a week, and are presently serving 110 families per week with numbers of those facing daily food insecurity rising. There is no cost to EASD families, who each Thursday arrive at the Ephrata Church of the Brethren to collect their nutritious food, including fresh fruits and vegetables, and a recipe with the needed ingredients provided to prepare the meal. It is an all-volunteer organization, so all monies donated go directly to help the families get food on the table so that children are well fed and ready to learn.

Stephanie Weber, the director and visionary behind this organization, will be joining us in worship on Sunday, January 7 to further introduce us to the important work being done to assist our struggling neighbors. Please plan to be present at 9:00 AM worship to welcome her and learn more.
