Finishing the Task Serving Today and Tomorrow

The new three-year campaign began in January 2015, and the new logo and theme identify the campaign's primary focus – Finishing the Task (Mortgage) while also illustrating the varied "faces" of Holy Trinity and the surrounding community we serve.



To date, we have received 40 pledges totaling \$153,452 and the number of individuals who stated they will give as able has increased to 57. Thank you! As of Sunday, November 15, a total of \$66,598.06 (\$40,403.00 – Pledged and \$26,195.06 – Give as Able) has been received. Thank you!

In January 2012, the mortgage amount stood at \$412,000 and due to the congregation's concerted effort, that amount has been reduced to the present figure of \$127,095. What a difference your regular commitment to Holy Trinity's Capital Campaign has made. Thank you!

We have now paid off more than 69% of the original 10-year mortgage, and we estimate there will be a savings of \$30,000 in interest charges if the remaining mortgage is paid off by the end of 2017, the last year of this campaign. We can reach this goal! What a joy it will be when we reach that goal, and funds can be directed toward other needed programs and ministries.

YEAR ROUND STEWARDSHIP

We begin a new church year challenging you to consider Christian Stewardship from an entirely new perspective. Rather than seeing stewardship as purely a "fund-raising" effort conducted each Fall, we hope to reframe and redefine stewardship as embracing how you live every day with God as your center.

What does it mean to have God at the very center of your life for all the choices and decisions you make? What does it say about how you manage both your health as well as about how you share your offerings? What does it say about your diet, about how you vote, about how you help your neighbors, about the chemicals you put on the lawn, and the choice of car you purchase?

Stewardship embraces all the choices we make and all the values we embrace in life, as stewards of God's creation. Over the course of the coming year, we will challenge you to consider your life in various ways from a faith perspective. Our hope is to expand the voice that faith has in your living.

Stewardship Special Giving for December ELCA MALARIA CAMPAIGN

For many years, the ELCA has been supporting clinics and programs in Africa that provide health care. Now, through the ELCA Malaria Campaign, we are focusing on malaria with new intensity. By joining hands with Lutheran partners in 13 African countries, we are becoming part of the global movement to make malaria history.

How we work

The ELCA Malaria Campaign funds programs of companion churches and Lutheran partners in education, prevention and treatment of malaria by:

- providing life-saving health care, including medicine to treat malaria
- training pastors, church volunteers and health care providers to diagnose and treat malaria
- teaching people how to protect themselves from the mosquitoes that spread malaria, recognize symptoms and seek treatment
- distributing insecticide-treated mosquito nets and providing training on proper use
- providing preventative medication to protect pregnant women and their babies
- encouraging governments to provide adequate health care and engage in malaria prevention activities
- supporting community projects to control the environments where mosquitoes breed
- promoting sustainable livelihoods through participation in village savings and loans groups so that community members can afford mosquito nets, transport and health care
- gathering people together to discuss the importance of malaria prevention and control

All of

you probably know the details of the birth of Jesus as presented by the gospels: The angelic announcement of a pregnancy, the Roman census, the trip to Bethlehem for Joseph and his pregnant intended, the shortage of housing available for the young couple in Bethlehem as Mary's time for delivery arrived, the animal and shepherd witnesses, and the angelic choirs. We can recite them as though they were a fairy tale fantasy treasured by one and all, but they were not just the details of a fictional story. Over the generations, countless millions of children have been born in less than stellar settings because the world had no place for them. Moreover, the flight of Mary, Jesus, and Joseph into Egypt to flee the crazed Herod depicts the life reality for far too many people across time. Jesus and his parents spent his early childhood years as refugees in Egypt, hiding from a very threatening life in their homeland.

Jesus' plight as a refugee in his infancy is the real life experience of far too many people, children and adults, in our world today. United Nation officials estimate that as many as twelve million people have fled the Syrian civil war, entering the world as refugees seeking safe asylum in foreign lands. Over four million of them have officially been registered as refugees according to international sources, and more than one half of them are women and children.

Sadly, the self-serving rhetoric of some have turned these refugees into threats to the safety of this country. Their words have let loose a flood of bigotries that lie slightly below the surface of American culture. I am repeatedly saddened by how easily our sense of Christian responsibility for those in need can be side-tracked by the ill-founded rants of others. The U.S. vetting process for all refugees desiring to enter the U.S. is extensive. If someone wishes to do us harm, there are far less risky ways to enter this country than as refugees

To simply deny admission to the U.S. for Syrian refugees, many of who are women and children, is patently wrong. Our Judeo-Christian heritage calls the faithful of this generation to care for the alien and the stranger among us. In a day of such hardship for the refugees, we can not shirk our Christian calling.

Christmas is not just a birthday celebration. It is the celebration of God among us and God can just as easily come among us as a refugee in need of our care. It was the first existence he knew! He calls us not to abandon those in need today. At the very least, remember the refugees in your prayers.

Ephrata Area Homes of Hope Stewardship Special Giving for January 2016

We have homeless families in Ephrata. It's easy for us to look around in our community during our daily lives and say we don't have homelessness in Ephrata. We don't see anyone sleeping on the sidewalk or on a bench.

So, where are they? – doubled up with family members, doubled up with friends, motel rooms, shelters, sleeping in their car or camping out.

We are fortunate in Ephrata to have a Homes of Hope program that covers the entire Ephrata Area School District. The program here in started with the first family in 2004 and thirteen churches in our community. Our program has three apartments in Ephrata to house families who are in transition from homelessness to getting back on their feet. We are also fortunate to have the support of churches like our congregation.

Local, Ephrata families are referred by churches or the local school social workers and then interviewed and screened by Love INC. Family's are in the program for 30 days as emergency housing and three months in the transitional housing phase. During this time we have people who work with them, as mentors and budget coaches, so they are ready to move to permanent housing by the end of the time.

Your donations to Ephrata Area Homes of Hope in part help pay for our case worker, who covers all Homes of Hope programs in Lancaster County. Other expenses include the cost of utilities (fuel oil, electricity, water/sewer, trash, etc) and minor repairs. Winter is the heaviest season for expenses, especially fuel oil. The homes we use are owned by local Churches but we take care of all utilities and some repairs. All contributions are tax deductible.

Ephrata Area Homes of Hope is Holy Trinity's Stewardship focus for January 2016. More information is on the display table in the gathering area. Please use your "special giving" envelope to help support this program that is all about families right here in our community.






