Alleluia. Jesus says, I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will last. Alleluia. John 15:16



During the past year, the consistent news regarding the growth of white Christian nationalism in this country has become concerning to me, and I imagine I am not alone.

By its nature, this brand of Christianity runs counter to the love-filled teachings of Jesus that call all those who profess Christianity as their faith to strive for inclusivity and welcome to all of God's beloved children no matter the color of their skin, their race, or other characteristic of their nature that some have chosen to use as a means of division. It clearly flies in the face of the fact that Jesus was not Caucasian but rather a Jewish man of Middle Eastern decent; thus, likely with darker features unlike the lighter-haired and skinned man with blue eyes with which he is often times depicted.

Placing Jesus' likely physical features aside, because we do not have descriptions of him when he was alive, we only have to explore the Holy Scriptures, which are awash with his universal message of unrestricted love, to understand the intent of his teachings. Jesus elevated the act of loving ones neighbor and welcoming the stranger over all else and did not place restrictions on these. Jesus' message was consistently one of life-giving redemption and new life, made possible by God, through his death and resurrection. This is gift freely and universally given and not reserved for one group of people over another group that is deemed unworthy of Jesus' sacrifice and the unconditional love it guarantees God's children—you, me, and all humankind.

If you follow the daily news you may have heard or read stories regarding groups of professed Christians and disturbingly pastors and other church leaders who are claiming that Jesus' teachings are far too lenient and to universally accepting. Instead, they profess and embrace a far more judgmental and exclusionary God, whom, if one is the right kind of Christian, should embrace, worship, and fear above all else. By their measure, this God is the true God, because He surely believes what they do. And as such is surely a God who would not tolerate, include, or offer forgiveness to any individuals or groups whose actions and in some cases very existence lies beyond the reach of God's grace-filled love. It is this self-defined God, who comfortably fits their world view and the biases they hold, who reigns as the one true God.

I imagine those of us who strive daily to humbly follow Jesus, despite our brokenness, see within this exclusionary world view and its goal to redefine Jesus' gracious mission, a glaring dismissal of the intent of this mission which is to bring the message of the Good News—sins forgiven and new life—to all the earth without prejudice or judgement. However, this mission and its goals are not up for debate and are not awaiting our desire to redefine them to fit our levels of comfort or our personal ideologies. Rather, it is we, if we choose to be faithful and sincere in our attempts to best follow Jesus, who must conform to Jesus' need for us to embrace his grace-filled message of love and be doers of that life-giving love for all to witness and experience without exception.
